**ASSUMPTION OF RISK, WAIVER OF LIABILITY
and HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT**

1. ASSUMPTION OF RISK. I am aware of the inherent risks of injury to myself or my dog involved in dog training, including without limitation, risks due to dog bite, the use of equipment, condition of premises, or infectious disease. I am aware of the risk of injury that may result from, among other causes, the active or passive negligence of THE KINETIC CANINE, LLC; its members, directors, officers and employees; ELIZABETH R. BRYANT, RICHARD L. BRYANT III - owner of the property (the "PREMISES") located at 18350 FM 150W, Driftwood, TX 78619; CATHY COBB, INKA WOLTER, CATHERINE POWELL, SUSAN RAMSBOTTOM, and all current and future assistants and their successors and assigns – (collectively the "RELEASED PARTIES"), including without limitation, the risk of negligent instruction or supervision. I am voluntarily engaged in dog training as a recreational activity with knowledge of the risks and I assume any and all known and unknown risks of injury, death, and property damage that may result from participation in dog training, practice, and events.

2. RELEASE OF LIABILITY. I release and agree to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless all of the RELEASED PARTIES named above from all liability to me and my representatives, guardians, successors, assigns, heirs, children, and next of kin for all liability, claims, damage, or demands for personal injury, death, or property damage, to me or my dog or dogs, arising from or related to this agreement or to participation in dog training, practice, and events, whether the injury, death, or property damage occurs on or off the PREMISES, including, without limitation, any injury, death or property damage caused by me or by my dog or dogs. **This release includes, without limitation, any personal injury, death, or property damage caused by the active or passive negligence of any of the RELEASED PARTIES. I bear sole responsibility for any loss.**

3. KNOWING AND VOLUNTARY EXECUTION. **I acknowledge that I have carefully read this agreement, understand its contents, and understand that this agreement includes an assumption of the risk of the RELEASED PARTIES' negligence and a release, waiver of liability, and hold harmless agreement.** I acknowledge that the RELEASED PARTIES are materially relying on this waiver in allowing me to use the PREMISES and to engage in dog training, practice, and events. I acknowledge that The Kinetic Canine, LLC. materially relies on this agreement in agreeing to render training services to me.

Advanced Obedience Class Information

The Advanced Obedience class is for dogs 4 months and older who have had a basic obedience class or puppy class but whose owners would like to sharpen their skills, prepare for the Canine Good Citizenship test or go on to dog sports or therapy work.

This class is suitable for dogs who know the basics (sit, down, stand, coming when called, and stay) but need to practice them around other dogs or in the presence of distractions. You must have completed a basic obedience class prior to beginning this class. Dogs must also be up-to-date on all vaccinations (proof of vaccination is required at the first class) and friendly towards other dogs and people.

NOTE: This is NOT a class for dogs that bark or lunge at other dogs aggressively on leash (please contact us if this describes your dog).

WHAT DO WE LEARN?

- Formal heeling (on leash and off)
- To go to a mat and stay there until released
- To stay in the presence of heavy distractions
- Targeting (both hand and object)
- To allow strangers to handle or groom them
- To stay happily with a stranger while you are out of sight
- To walk without pulling around other dogs, people and distractions
- To come when called past other dogs and around distractions
- Two tricks!

In addition to these new skills, we practice all the basics: sit, down, stand, stay, coming when called, and walking nicely on a leash. We play lots of games in class that utilize basic obedience skills rather than just drilling the same exercises over and over.

HOW LONG IS CLASS AND HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

Advanced obedience is 6 weeks long and costs \$150. It meets once a week for one hour each week. If you sign up for Basic Obedience at the same time (also a \$150 class) you can get both for \$225 (a \$75 discount) – you can take up to a three month break between classes so you can work them into your schedule.

WHEN CAN I START AND HOW DO I REGISTER?

New classes start every other month, so you shouldn't have long to wait. To reserve your spot in class, download and fill out a registration form and liability waiver or call or e-mail to have one sent to you. E-mail, fax or mail it in to us, before class starts, so we keep a spot open for you. Class sizes are limited, so early registration is recommended.

What do I need for our first class?

- Vaccine Records
 - This is important! I MUST see vaccine records or I will have to send you home.
- Your Dog!
 - If you have an excitable dog, exercise him before class if you can. Don't run him to the point of exhaustion, but enough to take the edge off his energy and let him focus on you during class.
 - Depending on your dog, you may want to hold dinner until after class. Some dogs will focus better on you if they are hungry, others do better after having had at least a snack. You may need to experiment a bit to find this out.
- Equipment
 - Bring your dog in a properly-fitted flat collar, martingale, harness, or Gentle Leader.
 - Bring a 4-6 foot leash (no flexis please).
- Treats
 - Should be soft and easy to eat (preferably no crumbs to sniff for)
 - Should be small (the size of your pinky fingernail for a large dog; half that size for a small dog)
 - Should be super-yummy! (pull out the big guns – cheese, hot dogs, deli meat... whatever drives your dog wild)
 - Bring more than you think you will need for the first class. After a few classes you will figure out how much you need.

Things to remember:

- Arrive 15 minutes early
 - You can give your dog a chance to potty before class begins.
 - It will also give your dog a chance to have a bit of a sniff and get settled in.
- If there is a class in session before yours, please wait out in the parking lot until that class is over.
- Please enter through the near gate, letting any exiting dogs out through the far gate.
- Give other dogs their space – don't crowd the gate and let dogs enter the field one at a time.



Policies

1. Refunds

- a. Refunds will be given after the first class for any reason (if you decide this class is not for you, return your materials and you will receive a full refund at the end of the first class).
- b. Refunds after the second class will be given at the discretion of the trainer, depending on circumstances (illness, change in circumstances, etc).

2. Vaccinations

a. Puppy Class

- i. Vaccination records must be provided at the first class, or the puppy will be turned away until such proof can be provided.
- ii. Puppies must have received at least two sets of age-appropriate vaccines and one de-worming or proof of negative stool sample by a licensed veterinarian at least one week prior to attending class. Vaccinations done by a breeder or administered at home are not acceptable.
- iii. Puppies are expected to be kept up-to-date on vaccines during the duration of their time in puppy class. Initial vaccine dates will be noted in the class file, and updated vaccine records will be requested as appropriate.
- iv. Puppies who enter puppy class with appropriate vaccines, but whose vaccine schedules are not maintained will be turned away from class until such proof can be provided. This is for the safety of all puppies in class.

b. All other classes

- i. Vaccination records must be provided before the dog attends his/her first class. Dogs will be turned away, should they arrive without records, until such proof can be provided.
- ii. Adult dogs must show proof of: DHPP (or equivalent) given once yearly unless written proof is provided by your vet that an extended vaccination schedule is acceptable, and Rabies given once or every three years (depending on type of vaccine given) by a licensed veterinarian. Proof of adequate titer levels done by a licensed veterinarian may be used as a substitute.
- iii. Bordetella (for kennel cough) is also strongly recommended for all dogs, but not required.

3. Class Length

- a. Puppy Class
 - i. Consists of eight classes, once a week.
- b. Basic & Advanced Obedience
 - i. Consists of six classes, once a week.
- c. All other classes
 - i. Consist of eight classes, once a week unless otherwise specified.

4. **Cancellations:** Occasionally class must be cancelled due to bad weather, for holidays, or other circumstances. If this happens, the class length gets extended by one week to make up for the lost week.

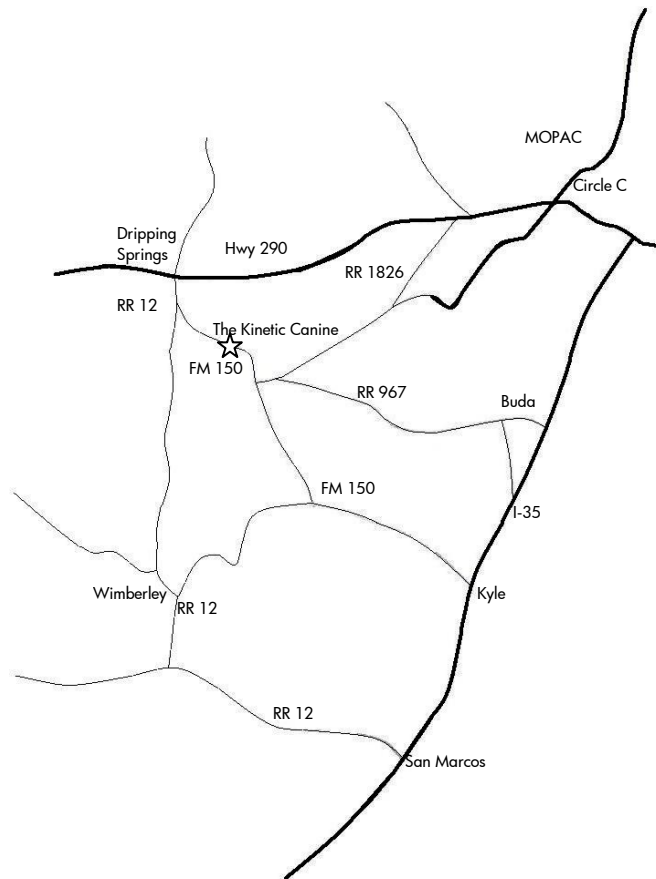
5. Attendance

- a. For all classes, if a client misses a week, it may not be made up by adding a week to the class length. For example, if a client misses one puppy class, they will still finish eight weeks from when they started.
- b. Make-up sessions: A client may request one free 15-20 minute make-up session for one class. This lesson will be scheduled at the convenience of the trainer, and will cover the material missed during the class.

6. Dual Registrations/Package Deals

- a. For clients signing up for Puppy and one other class, or Basic & Advanced
 - i. Prior to signing up, the client should look at the upcoming class schedule (available on the website) and make sure he/she can attend both classes.
 - ii. Clients may take up to two months between the end of the first class and the beginning of the second. It is the responsibility of the client to notify the trainer which class they plan on attending.

Map and Directions



From Dripping Springs: Take RR 12 South to FM 150. Make a left turn onto FM 150. The Kinetic Canine is approximately 4.5 miles on your left.

From Austin: Take MOPAC South to 45 South. Make a left turn onto RR 1826. Follow 1826 until it dead ends into FM 150. Make a right onto FM 150. The Kinetic Canine is approximately 1 mile up on your right.

From Buda: Take RR 967 west to RR 1826. Make a left turn onto RR 1826 and follow it until it dead ends into FM 150. Make a right onto FM 150. The Kinetic Canine is approximately 1 mile up on your right.

From Kyle: Take FM 150 W for approximately 16 miles. The Kinetic Canine is on your right, approximately 1 mile past RR 1826.

From Wimberley: Take RR 12 north to FM 150. Make a right turn onto FM 150. The Kinetic Canine is approximately 4.5 miles on your left.
